A Message from Gary Jordan, CEO

2019 was an active and successful year with many accomplishments to celebrate. We want to thank our providers and staff for the great work done in 2019. We had 93% of our employees participate in the employee engagement survey this past year. This high response rate shows their interest and desire to have an exceptional organization. The success and growth of CRMC is directly related to the individuals we are able to recruit and retain in our organization.

Health Care financials continue to be a challenge for the industry in 2019. We had another successful year out performing our budget as well as our peers in the state of Iowa. Again, recognized as a Top 100 Critical Access Hospital showing that CRMC is well positioned for the ever changing environment in the health care industry.

We prepared for CMS (Medicare and Medicaid) surveys for both the hospital and clinics. We hired a consulting firm to help us receive Rural Health Clinic (RHC) certifications for our Aurelia and Marcus clinics. We are pleased that both of them are now certified making all four clinics (Aurelia, Cherokee, Holstein, and Marcus) RHCs. All four clinics passed their surveys and the hospital passed its survey in December. The staff and managers did an excellent job of preparing for the surveys and continue to be compliant with CMS regulations.

In 2019, there was a focus on renewing and planning in our organization. With the Beck and Wellness Center at or approaching 20 years in service, the renewal of those buildings and equipment along with the hospital was part of our planning. There was much focus on the outside of the building as the storm water system and roofs were upgraded with projects continuing into 2020. Critical electrical and mechanical equipment was upgraded to ensure serviceability and to reduce risk of failure due to age and lack of parts. The Medical/Surgical floor patient rooms received a welcome facelift with new paint and decor. In addition, the walkway was upgraded with new siding, windows and interior finishes providing a fresh look and positive environment for staff to enter the facility.

Planning was a major focus for 2019 as the new three year plan was completed from the Community Health Needs Assessment. A new Strategic Plan for the organization was developed along with updating

our Mission, Vision and Values. New processes were developed for both the operational and capital budgets that allow more input from managers and staff and increases awareness of capital needs across the organization.

New investments in technology with the addition of new a 3D Mammography unit and MRI to the Radiology Department, and new orthopedic table to our Surgery Department to add total hip surgeries to the growing list of services at CRMC.

Physician Recruitment and procurement of additional care services was a main priority. CRMC partnered with Senior Life Solutions which provides mental health care to senior citizens, and Dr. Emily Anzmann was recruited to open CRMC's Foot and Ankle Clinic while becoming our first full time Podiatrist. She is off to great start providing clinical and surgical services to the area. The True Medical building was remodeled to add both these services along with a new sleep lab.

We also signed contracts with three Emergency Department providers to enable CRMC to have a full time dedicated emergency group focused on providing the latest in Emergency Room care. The recruitment of additional Family Practice providers with OB credentials was very active with dozens of phone interviews and on-site interviews. We are pleased to have signed two physicians who will join us over the next couple of years. We will continue to recruit and plan to add at least one more family physician.

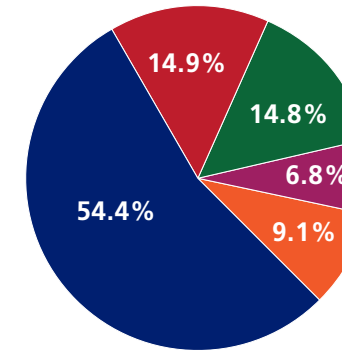

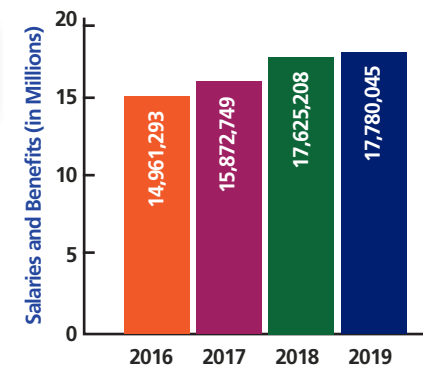

The equipment purchases were in response to an increased need for these types of rehabilitation services.

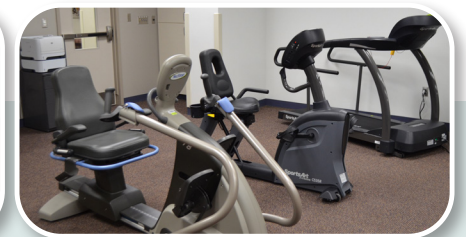
CRMC Quilters/Auxiliary Donate Transport Chairs
